Challenge

Many hospital systems face challenges in reducing costs and achieving product standardization. In order to achieve these goals, HSHS engaged the MDM team to better understand their hip and knee implant utilization. During a recent Orthopedic Quarterly Business Review, the MDM team identified a reusable drill bit that was being billed as a disposable in each case resulting in over \$119k in overcharges for a single item. Solution
